June 20, 1964 JUNE MEETING June 20, 1964 SATURDAY evening, June 20th, will be N. R. H. S. family meeting night at the TROLLEY PARK just west of Glenwood, Oregon. Our hosts will be the Willamette Valley Electric Railway Association (WVERA) with the very much appreciated help of the Oregon Electric Historical Society (OEHS). O. E. H. S. is the owner of TROLLEY PARK. Together they operate the Glenwood Electric Railway which now has over 1000 of track under wire! Official meeting time is 8:00 P. M.; however, there is nothing to prevent anyone coming out earlier and having a picnic "al fresco". Picnic tables have not yet been installed. "The Bonanza" Restaurant, just beyond junction of Highway #6 and road from Forest Grove serves good meals. Ray Shumway of OEHS will have the generator working and power on, and our chartered train will be the famous British Columbia Electric Railway coach #1304 coupled to the equally famous observation car "Bridge River", formerly the Oregon Electric Railway parlor car "Champoeg". It is fondly hoped that your TRAINMASTER editor, "Motorman" Nelson Hickok, will be out of the hospital in time to be with us. This issue is being edited by "Conductor Miln" Gillespie. Bring film and flash attachments, as we will have both daylight and night-time running of the cars. Other traction equipment at Glenwood includes a (Bay Area) Key System articulated unit, a double-truck open "breezer" from Sydney, Australia, Los Angeles Transit Lines narrow-gauge streetcar #1318, Council Crest streetcar #503, Portland Traction Co. interurban car #4022 (ex-Pacific Electric).

Operating the power generator costs money, and we want to pay our way in full, plus providing some profit (working capital) for our hosts. WVERA will be selling tickets at a cost of \$1.00 per family, 50 cents for a single adult, and 25 cents per child not covered by family ticket. These tickets cover entire evening's rides. WVERA will also provide "coffee and—" refreshments in the "Bridge River" car where we will also have a short business meeting some time during the evening. Please come prepared to be generous with their refreshment "kitty" to help their car maintenance fund. If you have (or can scrounge) used BOYD COFFEE can lids, bring them to this meeting, please, as WVERA turns them in to Boyd Coffee Company for needed "pin money" cash. Frank Weiler, President of WVERA, says they appreciate this very much. To reach TROLLEY PARK, drive out Sunset Highway to junction of Highway #6 which goes to Tillamook via Glenwood. About a mile beyond "downtown Glenwood", on right side of road is a large wooden sign labelled "TROLLEY PARK". A few hundred yards beyond, turn right on (next) gravelled road which crosses Gales Creek and takes you to parking area of Trolley Park, and home of owner-operator Paul Class.

In order that as many of our Chapter members as possible may have an opportunity to meet President Lew Pardee, there will be a special meeting at Miln Gillespie's house, 3549 S. W. Grover St., Portland, at 8:00 P. M. Tuesday evening, June 23^{rd} . We will have a "buss session" on plans and ideas for the 1965 convention. The ideas and enthusiam of everyone of our members and railfan friends are important, for it is the cooperative effort of all and the division of work and responsibility which will be necessary to make the 1965 N. R. H. S. National Convention in Portland an outstanding success. To reach Miln's house, go up S. W. Patton Road to top of hill where St. Thomas More Catholic Church is on right and Shell station on left. Dosch Road (connection from Baldock Freeway and Salem area) joins Patton Road at this point. Opposite Shell gas station is a large parking lot, and around the perimeter is S. W. Hillside Drive. Turn left off Patton Road on S. W. Hillside and go downhill two blocks to S. W. A trip on this scenic line will be one of the highlights of the 1965 Portland Convention. Engine #105, a 2-6-2 "Prairie" was built by Baldwin in 1925 for the Oregon-American Lumber Co. which operated in mainline log train service out of Vernonia to the woods until closure of operations in 1958. Rolling stock is all originally Oregon Electric but was purchased from the Pacific Great Eastern Railway where it had been used for many years after end of Oregon Electric passenger service in 1933.

Inaugural press run of the "Sunset Line" was Sunday, May $24^{\rm th}$, for the press and invited guests. Our chapter member, C. J. Keenan, was one of those making dedicatory remarks. Excursion trains are run by regular S. P. & S. Rly. Train and engine crews.

MC CLOUD RIVER R. R. STEAM trips

Some California railfans have formed an organization named Mt. Shasta-Alpine Scenic Railway to operate McCloud River R. R. steam locomotive #25, an 2-6-2, between Mt. Shasta (on S. P. main line) and Summit Water Tower. Early morning schedule leaves McCloud, Calif. at 7:30 A. M. arriving Mt. Shasta (S. P. Depot) at 8:45 A. M. Three round-trips are operated between Mt. Shasta and Pierce station (Summit) before train leaves Mt. Shasta at 3:30 P. M. and returns to McCloud headquarters and roundhouse at 5:00 P. M. Trains will consist of an open-platform Western Pacific observation car, a Southern Pacific coach, and a passenger-carrying flat car of the McCloud River Railroad. Dates of operation are these days only (unless future trips scheduled at last minute. Dates are: July 1 - 2 - 3 - 4 - 5 - 6th, August 22nd-23rd, and September 4-5-6-7th. Fares are \$2.80 for adults and \$1.90 for children under 12 years. Both McCloud River R. R. and Yreka Western Railroad will supply steam power.
