

## PACIFIC NORTHWEST RAILFAN CONFERENCE

The 1st annual conference of Pacific Northwest Railfan's was held last weekend in Tacoma, hosted by the TACOMA CHAPTER and the PUGET SOUND RAILWAY HISTORICAL ASSOCIATION. Attendance was about 80 fans representing ten clubs. Among those attending from PNW Chapter were Alex Ceres, Jack Holst, Roger Sackett, Roger Phillips, Harry Harvey, Ken Dethman, Nelson Hickok, Chuck Storz & Miln Gillespie.

Agreement was reached by officers of the clubs present to establish a coordinating agency for the scheduling of fan trips and excursions in the Northwest. Gardner Coleman & Art Hamilton of PSRHA & NRHS agreed to handle this project. Clubs desiring to operate trips will notify them of the proposal & they will publish listings of dates of trips...in cases of conflicts, involved parties will be notified & an attempt to correct conflicts will be made. This coordination will help eliminate equipment problems, ease competition for fares, and allow the fan to plan his trip rides with minimum of conflicts & more advance notice.

Activities at the conference included an excellent tour of the Milwaukee shops featuring operation of an electric locomotive & electric rotary snowplow, a visit to the "Camp 6" logging museum, a banquet with program of logging slides by Pete Replinger (Tacoma NRHS) Doug Cummings (B.C. NRHS) and Jack Holst (PNW NRHS) and logging movies of Canadian loggers by El White (B.C. Rwy. Historical Society). Sunday featured operations at PSRHA's museum at Snoqualmie Falls with 2-8-2 #70 (ex Rayonier #70) and 2-6-0TT #17 (ex Canadian Colleries #17) operating doubleheaded and singlely.
