STIMSON SHAY RESTORATION PROJECT

At the October meeting the membership voted to undertake complete restoration of the former Stimson Lumber Company # 1, 42ton 2 truck Shay. This Shay was once displayed fat the big log cabin (near Wards) which burned to the ground a few years ago. The fire also burned the cab from the shay. The Shay was moved to the Oaks Park by the City after the fire and has since been quietly deteriorating on "display".

We have arranged with the City for permission to do this project and now have our own lock on the enclosure at the Oaks so that we can work when we wish. There is about 100 feet of track available for trials once we get the Shay overhauled. Electric power is available for power tools. Our first work party erected a plastic shelter over the cab & this is being extended to cover the boiler so that we can work in the dry in any weather.

We have had four work parties to date with much work already accomplished. Those who have turned out most regularly to date include Roger Sackett (& son Randy), Bob Hoffman, Jim Gilmore, Woody Woodruff, Jack Holst, Ken Dethman, & John Hollcway. My apology for not listing everyone who helped.

Work accomplished to date includes building the shelter, removal of rotten pilob beams; running boards & steps, removal of the dummy stack, removal of air tank, steam pump & misc. unneeded pipe, cleaning and overhaul of valve gear & lubricator and many small projects.

Major projects will include removal of the oil and water tank, replacement of decking, welding a broken frame member, rebuilding the cab, welding of a patch on the water tank, welding a patch in the smokebox, converting of the firing back to the left side of the cab, replacement of pilot beams, running boards, etc.(anyone have any spare 10"x14"x10' beams?). Boiler work needed will have to await the results of a hydrostatic test which can't be given until other items are complete.

We need help to accomplish this restoration. Carpenters are especially needed at this time. Someone who can weld and who has welding equipment would be a boon to the project. There is also lots of work for those of us with lessor skills scrapping paint, wielding wrenches, etc. Please help!
