PNW CHAPTER NRHS

Summary of Minutes, Regular Meeting, 17 April 1974

The meeting was called to order by PNW Chapter President Roger W Sackett at 8:10 PM in the Burlington Northern Safety Assembly Room.

The minutes of the previous meeting held on Friday, 15 March 1974 were read and approve?.

Roger Sackett reported that Amtrak is not interested in leasing the Chapter's sleeper-lounge car Mt Hood at the present time because of its interior configuration. Amtrak wants coaches and pullmans now, but will keep the Mt Hood on their availability list for possible future use.

Roger Sackett reported on the possible joint acquisition with the Vernonia, South Park, and Sunset Railroad of the Union Pacific commisary building on N W 9th Avenue for a museum and meeting rooms. The Union Pacific indicated that the building was not available for such a purpose and that they had plans to establish a salvage depot there in the near future.

Roger Phillips reported on trip plans for the 1974 National Convention of NRHS to be held in San Francisco, California over the Labor Day weekend. He said that it would be possible to take the Mt Hood to Oakland at the same cost as twelve first class and eight coach fares. A request has been made to Amtrak for regular space southbound on the Coast Starlight, but no reply has been received as yet. Dick Kaufman suggested the possible charter of the Mt Hood for OSU and U of O football booster trips to California.

Walter Grande announced that the subject of the May program will be the Southern Pacific in Oregon. Walt asked those who have material on the SP to sign a list which he circulated. The June program will be movies and slides on the Trans Siberian Railroad to be arranged for by Alfred Haij.

Chuck Storz reported for Chapter Librarian Al Zimmerman that a discount has been arranged for Chapter members on the purchase of railroad books. Orders must be placed through Al.

Roger Sackett announced that Union Pacific steam locomotive 8444 will be in Portland on April 22 and 23 as part of the ceremonial trip to Expo '74 at Spokane, Washington.

John Holloway announced that Railcon '74 will be held in Vancouver, British Columbia on June 1 and 2. Registration fee is \$19.00. Program includes tours of the Roberts Bank coal loading facility and the Canadian Pacific Roundhouse in Vancouver.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:50 PM.

EXTRA BOARD

The Union Pacific has really gone all out for the opening of Expo '74 at Spokane, Washington. In addition to the flag gathering special with 8444, the UP ran a directors' special from Portland, Oregon to the fair. The special departed Portland at 7:30 AM on Friday, May 3 with the following consist: E9 A units 960 and 954, sleeper #202 "Pacific Domain", business car #103, sleeper "omaha", dome lounge #9004, business car "Arden", and business car #100.

On April 25 the private cars #06 "Golden Moon" and #33 "Imperial Leaf" were in the Portland Union Station. These cars are owned by the Charter Wire Company of Milwaukee, Wisconsin and are on an extended sales tour for the owning company.

There will be a display of equipment at the Portland Union Station on Wednesday, May 15 in connection with National Transportation Week. The UP, SP, BN, and Milwaukee will participate with cars and locomotives. Details not available at this writing.

Effective May 6, new Amtrak SDP40F's went into through service between Seattle, Washington and Los Angeles, California on trains 11 and 14, the Coast Starlight. This ends the power exchange between SP SDP45's and Amtrak and BN "E" and "F" units at Portland which has been in effect for some time. New Amtrak units spotted so far are in the 550 number series, with builder's date of April 1974. Amtrak expects to have trains 5 & 6, 7 & 8, 9 & 10, 11, 12, 13, and 14 all operating with new SDP40F's by July 1, 1974.

Long time Portland hobby shop operators Vic and Connie Stuhr have sold their business to Dave Frezza.

An article on the Northwest Live Steamers operation at Shady Dell (Oregon) appears in the May 1974 issue of Sunset magazine.

The Union Pacific and Burlington Northern, in a joint project, are building a new connection to serve the new Terminal #6 container dock in the Port of Portland's Rivergate area. The track branches off the BN (SP&S) main line at North Portland Junction. A bridge is under construction over North Portland Road and an entirely new grade is being prepared to the dock site. This seems to effectively bypass any use of the Peninsula Terminal Railroad to reach the developing Rivergate industrial area.

The General Electric service shop in northwest Portland seems to be doing a continuing business in rebuilding smaller motive power for shortline and industrial railroads. Recently spotted on the service shop lead: Weyerhaeuser Company FM switcher #481.

According to a news release, the Kalmbach Publishing Company will be one of the sponsors on Chicago FM station WOJO of a program for, by, and about railfans and railroaders. Program content will include news of railfan events plus reviews of several of Kalmbach's books.

NEW RAIL YARD NAMED

Burlington Northern recently announced plans for an industrial development south of Bend, Oregon. The site is to be known as "CASCAN".

During the search for a suitable name, Pacific Northwest Chapter members of NRHS were among those consulted for suggestions. Many names were considered, but eliminated because of possible duplications (Stevens with Stevenson, South Bend, et cetera). Pumice, Obsidian, Paulina, and Bannock were among others suggested.

"Cascan" was the name finally chosen. It is a geologic term coined from the words Cascade Andesite which is an igneous extrusive rock formation abundant in the Cascade Mountains to the west of Bend. The term "Andesite" is derived from the Andes Mountains of South America where this type of volcanic rock was first discovered.
