Spend a day at Train Mountain during their Fall Meet, September 9-11, 2005.

Enjoy the late summer daylight and early fall colors on this excursion aboard Amtrak's Coast Starlight to Southern Oregon. There we'll see and ride a huge variety of one-eighth scale locomotives and rolling stock operating on 25 miles of world-class trackage at Train Mountain Railroad Museum. Train Mountain holds the Guiness World Record for the largest miniature railroad, and their meets attract thousands of rail enthusiasts from around the US and Canada.

This Chapter activity is open to members and invited guests, and includes:

* Round-trip coach travel on the Coast Starlight, * Two nights lodging including continental breakfasts * Shuttle bus to and from Train Mountain, * Admission fee, boxed lunch and banquet dinner at Train Mountain

This is a special opportunity for members all along the west coast to enjoy a Chapter activity. From Washington to California, and all stops in between, if you can board the Coast Starlight, you can join the fun.

Prices are subject to change, but current price estimates (based on Amtrak travel from Portland) are:

* One adult, with one bed: \$226 per person * Two adults, with one bed: \$182 per person * Two adults, with two beds: \$191.50 per person * One senior, with one bed: \$212.50 per person * Two seniors, with one bed: \$168.50 per person * Two seniors, with two beds: \$178 per person

The above prices will be slightly higher for departures from Washington, and slightly lower from stations south of Portland. Prices are even lower from California, due to lower lodging costs.

NARP, AAA and Child discounts are available also. Please inquire for specific pricing, specifying the age of each person in your party, and how you wish to room together.

This package price covers everything except your meals while onboard the Coast Starlight. Passengers are free to bring their own snacks, buy food in the Sightseer Lounge, or enjoy a meal in the full-service diner.

PNWC-NRHS, Membership meeting minutes May 20, 2005

Chapter President Ron McCoy called the meeting to order at 7:33, and welcomed with new members Jerry and Betsy Tanguist, and Henri Larose. Ron read the names of three more new members:

Bryan Leeder of Woodburn, Oregon; Dan Shafer of Lodi, California; and Craig Martin of Seattle, Washington.

Due to an error by the Secretary, a motion to approve the minutes of the April memberhsip meeting was not recorded accurately.

Ron reminded members that as part of the Chapter's rekeying project, members who have old keys to Room 1 can return their key to Dave Van Sickle and receive a refund of be staffing the Room 1 library from 1:30 to 4:00 on May their \$10 key deposit.

Convention Chair Arlen Sheldrake said that while order processing is lagging, registration numbers as of May 10 were 546 registrations representing 1,214 potential attendees. Still no commitment from the Union Pacific Railroad about bringing a steam locomotive to Portland for for the last three years, and has been the Chapter's National the convention. Volunteer Coordinate Keith Fleschner says many people have been stepping forward to fill volunteer slots.

Non-rail Events Chair Chuck McGaffey added that the Ruby Junction tour and Willamette Shore Trolley trips are showing strong interest.

Unfortunately, the APMA tour did not pan out well, and has been canceled.

Treasurer Ken Peters said that April expenses exceed income, before even including a pending payment for movement of the flanger to APMA. Donations to offset recurring monthly expenses are always appreciated.

Keith Fleschner said the monthly rolling stock work party would begin at 10:00 with donuts at Linnton.

Al Hall is coordinating the Chapter's participation in an event the weekend of June 18-19 at Multnomah Falls. The US Forest Service is organizing an event they're calling the Columbia Gorge History of Transportation. Along with the Chapter's rail archives, vintage automobiles and trucks will also be on display along the historic Old Columbia Gorge Highway.

Ron reminded everyone that there are lots of opportunities to volunteer, in many different skill areas, and many different levels of commitment. The Chapter's growth feeds directly from the number of members who get involved, and there's always something for everyone who has time to make a positive contribution.

A good time was had by all on the recent day trip to Seattle, held May 14. 24 passengers enjoyed a round trip on Amtrak Cascades, along with a tour of downtown Seattle's historical and transportation attractions, hosted by

Chapter President Ron McCoy. About two-thirds of those who went were first-time rail passengers. Meanwhile, the Chapter's September Amtrak trip to Train Mountain is building momentum, and a sign-up sheet was circulated for interested members.

Activities Chair Darel Mack said that tentative plans were unfolding around the idea of holding the Chapter's annual picnic at a local 1/8th scale railroad. Library Commitee Chair Irv Ewen said that Ralph Johnson would 21 and 28.

Ron read a letter from Regional Vice President Gerald Schuler announcing his resignation as Regional VP effective December 31, 2005.

Gerald has served as Regional VP (a National position) Director for the past twelve. National will be soliciting nominees to fill Gerald's position. Ron thanked Gerald for his many years of service, both to the Chapter and to the National organization.

The "Unsung Hero" award for May 2005 went to Maxine Rodabaugh.

Maxine provides extensive support to the Trainmaster publication and mailing processes, and until only recently also served as Membership Chair.

Maxine was also the Chapter's Jack M. Holst Memorial Award recipient for 2001. As the senior member of the nominating committee (composed of the 2001, 2002 and 2003 winners), Maxine presented the Jack M. Holst Memorial Award for 2004 to Glenn Laubaugh. Glenn spends many hours each month editing the Trainmaster, one of the most important Chapter functions there is, since the Trainmaster -- the Chapter's official publication -- goes to all Chapter members every month. Glenn also donates his time to manage the excursions mailing list, present membership meeting programs, chairs the Museum Commitee, and was responsible for the Chapter's internet presence from the mid-nineties until just recently.

In other news:

Jan Zweerts said the Lewis & Clark Explorer would undergo a dry run on May 21st. There will be no shuttle bus to take passengers from Union Station to Linnton this year. Tickets are available through Tickets West at 800-992-TIXX or www.ticketswest.com.

Jan also mentioned that the Rose City Garden Railway club will be having an open-house tour on July 9 at Portland locations, and July 10 in Vancouver.

Al Hall reported that the new Willamette Shore Trolley timetable is available. The 2005 APMA Steam-Up brochure is out also, and the upgrades at APMA include expansions to the OERHS trolley line and rolling stock.

Ron McCoy said Seattle's George Benson Waterfront Streetcar is in jeopardy. After two decades of popular operation, the street car is facing the loss of its barn at the north end of the waterfront.

Another public agency is pushing to have the facility demolished because it has other intentions for the land. A legal battle has already begun, but Ron says that he was cautioned that the streetcar may cease operations at the end of the summer. Also, the bus tunnel under downtown Seattle will be undergoing a lengthy closure to install rails that are compatible with the planned light rail and to construct a wye underground.

Jim Long said the Spirit of Washington dinner train is also threatened by King County's desire to tear up the tracks and pave the right-of-way for a jogging trail. The Spirit of Washington contends that both the rail and the trail can co-exist within the existing right-of-way.
