Ride with us to Southern Oregon and experience world-class scale railroading at Train Mountain, the world's largest miniature railroad. With over 133,000 feet of 7½" track located on over 2000 acres in Klamath County, Train Mountain is an unparalleled paradise for the model railroad enthusiast. That's over 25 miles of total trackage, spurs and sidings!

Train Mountain is famous worldwide, and is listed in the 2004 Guinness Book of World Records as the world's longest miniature hobby railroad. As a world-class scale layout, Train Mountain draws thousands of railroaders every year.

The excitement begins when we board the Coast Starlight in Portland on Friday May 30 to travel to Klamath Falls. The Coast Starlight is one of America's most scenic train journeys, and as the late spring twilight chases the train through the Cascade mountains, you can enjoy dinner in the full-service dining car, savor a special snack of your own, or just relax in the observation car while getting to know your fellow passengers. Upon arriving in Klamath Falls, a hotel courtesy shuttle will transport you to your comfortable accommodations for a restful night's sleep.

In the morning, a deluxe motorcoach will pick you up at your door and take you into the high ponderosa pine forest for a full day of adventure at Train Mountain.

At Train Mountain, you'll be treated to a walking tour of the main station and shop area. Watch for steam engines on the turntable or in the pit tracks, getting fired up and oiled for their day's run. Count how many types of locomotives you can spot: Pacifics, 0-4-0's, Northerns, maybe even a Challenger! Keep an eye out for F-7s, SD70's, AC-4400's, or S-2's. Train Mountain even has a "logging camp" area where Shays and other geared locomotives haul loads of timber.

After the morning tour and train ride, you'll be treated to a picnic lunch on the Train Mountain grounds, compliments of PNWC Excursions. In the afternoon, you'll be free to pursue your own interests, and with all there is going on at Train Mountain, you'll have no trouble finding countless unique and charming replicas of your favorite railroading equipment.
