HOYT HOTEL HONORS NATIONAL RAILROAD HALL OF FAME

Behind the desk in the lobby of the Hoyt Hotel in Portland, Oregon is a Commemorative Picture, which encloses smaller photos, of the four original and only members of the Casey Jones Fellowship, better known as the "Big Four of Railroad Romance". The only member still living is our own Chapter member Charles J. (Jeff) Keenan, who was a brakeman at the age of 13, a fireman at 15, and an engineer at 17. Jeff is Chairman of the Board of the National Railroad Hall of Fame and Museum, Inc. The other three members of the Casey Jones Fellowship were: Simeon T. Webb, Casey Jones' Fireman, who died July 13, 1957 at the age of 83 years. Mrs. Casey Jones, Casey's widow, who died in their home town of Jackson, Tennessee on November 21, 1958 at the age of 92; and Robert Taylor "Bob" McMillan, who retired as an engineer on the Illinois Central streamliner "City of New Orleans" at the age of 84 years. He died June 12, 1961 at the age of 89 at Centralia, Illinois, fellow citizens of that City erected a monument to his memory.

The members of the Casey Jones Fellowship were chosen by seven Railroad Presidents under the auspices of the National Railroad Hall of Fame. Occasion was the 50th anniversary of the death of Casey Jones at Vaughn, Mississippi on April 30th, 1900. Dedicatory ceremonies were held April 30, 1950 at Jackson, Tennessee, Casey's home. Purpose of the Casey Jones Fellowship was to confer appropriate honor on not more than four living persons who have played top roles in the romance of the Railroads. The Fellowship expires with passing of the four members. M. G.
