Summary of Minutes, Regular Meeting, 15 February 1974

The meeting was called to order by PNW Chapter President Roger Sackett at 8:05 PM in the Burlington Northern Safety Assembly Room.

Minutes of the January meeting were approved as read.

President Sackett reported receipt of approval from the Burlington Northern to rent the Chapter-owned sleeper-lounge car "Mount Hood" to Amtrak. He said also that he had been contacted by a representative of Amtrak about the possible rental. Before finalizing any arrangements with Amtrak the Mount Hood will have to be moved to BN's King Street yards at Seattle, Washington for inspection. Also, the car will have to be painted in Amtrak colors.

John Holloway announced the field trip for Saturday the 16th of February. Itinerary will include tracking the Oregon Electric and Southern Pacific Red Electric rights-of-way in the west Portland and Beaverton area.
